

Regulation Number 02/PPGCR/2018 of March 23, 2018.

It provides for courses validating procedure in *PPG-CR*.

The Board of PPG-CR of the UFSC, in the use of its attributions, establishes:

Art.1- According to the PPG-CR Rules of Procedure, student that are regularly enrolled may request validation of courses attended as a regular or special student in other *stricto sensu* graduate programs accredited by the *Coordenação de Aperfeiçoamento de Pessoal de Nível Superior* (CAPES) and *lato sensu* graduate courses offered by the University, upon approval by the Board and in accordance with the equivalence rules in the regiment of the program.

§ 1 ° Credits may be recognized and validated in both mandatory and elective courses;

§ 2° Elective courses studied in the master's degree of this program as a special student may be recognized, since attended before enrollment as a regular student of the course within a maximum time limit of two years;

§ 3 - Up to 3 (three) credits of *lato sensu* graduate courses may be validated.

Art.2 The Board must analyze the recognition possibility of a course.

§ 1 – To validate the mandatory courses, it will be required the content and course load equivalence;

§ 2 - Courses that are equivalent to or complementary to the elective courses of PPG-CR may be recognized if their contribution for the student's study plan is demonstrated;

§ 3 - The validation of the course will depend on the consent of the supervisor in the application.

§ 4 - The credits obtained in teacher internship will not be validated.

Art.3° - To request the course equivalence the student must present the following documents:

- a) Application for course validation;
- b) Program of the required course(s);
- c) Educational history of the course(s).

Art.4 - Credits will be validated by analyzing the supporting documentation and must comply with the following parameters:

I. The credit unit count considers 15 hours as corresponding to 1 credit and the score goes from 0 (zero) to ten (10), considering seven (7.0) the minimum approval mark.

II. In the case of concepts, as follows: concept A between 9.0 and 10.0, B between 7.0 and 8.5, C from 5.0 to 6.5, D between 4.0 and 4.5 and any other letter or symbol will be considered as concept D. The highest mark of each concept will be given.

III. For discrepant marks between the criteria of the institution of origin and those of PPG-CR, percentage correspondence will be used (disregarding the fractions).

Art. 5 - PPG-CR Delegated Board will solve omitted cases.
